Executive Director Comments

 The US Army Field Band performed a rousing program of music ranging from patriotic to classical to contemporary symphonic favorites. Highlights of the evening included Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue*, music from *Star Wars* and Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*, and a musical salute to each of the branches of the US military.
 The US Army Band provides concerts free of charge to communities throughout the country. Their contract stipulates that no admission can be charged for their performances. However, our venue incurred costs including the theater workforce, comprised of skeletal stage, maintenance, ticket office, and concessions staff. Marketing costs are also sustained by the presenting venue. Concessions sales were light as were At Will Donations.
 At the opening of the performance the colors were presented by the American Legion Honor Guard/Color Guard of Normal Post 635 and Bloomington Post 56. An enjoyable evening was experienced by all and many patrons left the building whistling or humming selections from that evening's performance.
