

Top 5 Fire Responses












Fire Response Times June 2019













June 2019 Operations Report



June continued to be a busy month for the department. The department responded to 938 calls for service, this was 58 less incidents than we responded to in May. Of the 938 incidents, 735 or 78.36% were EMS related and 203 or 21.64% were fire related. Total estimated Fire Loss for the month was \$60,950. We had one significant fire in the month which resulted in an estimated \$45,000 loss.

For the first half of the year the department has responded to 5473 calls for service this is 140 more than what we had responded to in 2018.

The department had an ambulance respond to Hardin, Illinois at the request of MABAS. On June 27th we sent 2 members in Medic 3 along with unit and personnel from Normal Fire Department to assist with providing EMS service to areas that were or have been flooded. The request indicated that the deployment would continue till July 10th.

The department averaged 31.2 incidents per day.

Department fire investigators investigated 2 fires in June.

Engine 1 was the busiest fire apparatus with 175 runs.


Medic 1 was the busiest ambulance with 294 runs.

Saturday was our busiest days of the week with 152 incidents over the month.

3:00 pm to 4:00 pm was our busiest time of the day.

- Charges represent billings for emergency transports, intercepts, and ambulance standby's.
- Revenue represents the amount of revenue collected for emergency transports, intercepts, and ambulance stand by's.
- Contractual/Miscellaneous Write Off's- are the combination of contractual allowances and miscellaneous write off's. Contractuals are the amounts above what federal and state mandated carriers allow for EMS services. Miscellaneous write off's include Financial Hardships, Bankruptcies, Small Balances, Workman's Compensation, and Incarcerated Patients.
- Bad Debt-Write off's on the accounts forwarded to a third party collection agency for further collection processing \$63,395.75


