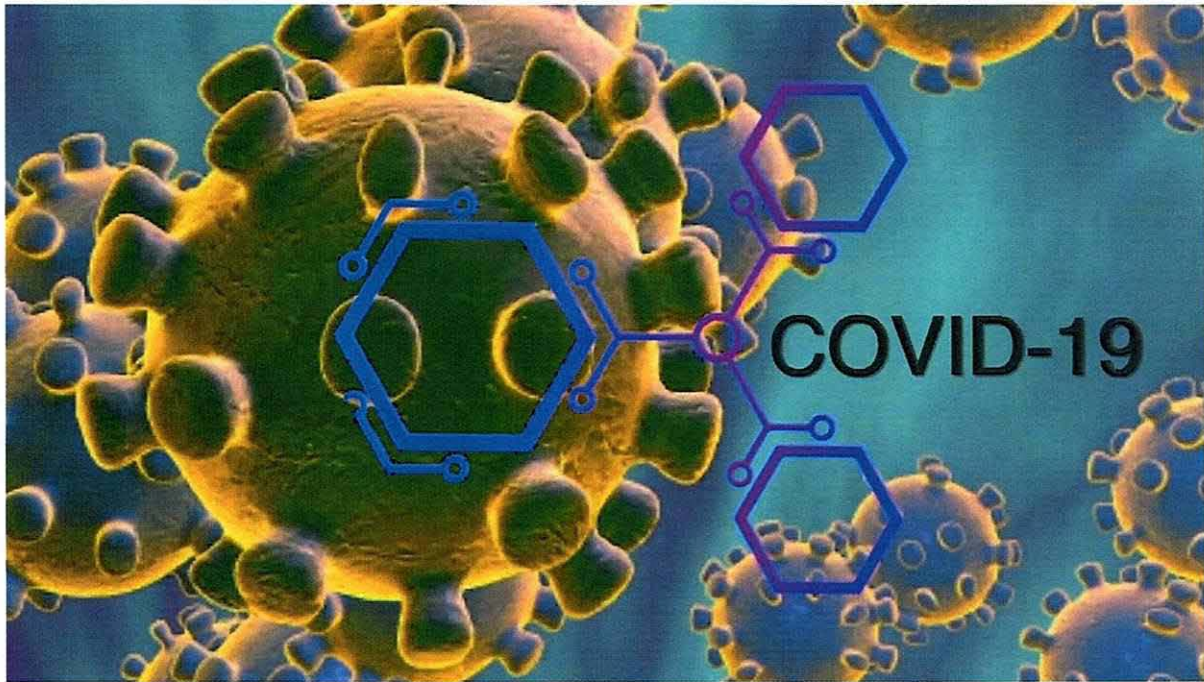








## § 6.1 INTRODUCTION

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Pritzker issued Executive Order 2020-10, prohibiting the operation of nonessential businesses and enacting a stay-at-home order. Soliciting for business door-to-door is not considered an essential business and rather creates a unique public health risk during the pandemic. It counters social distancing and represents a danger to the health and safety of the community.

## § 6.2 AUTHORITY

On March 26, 2020, the City Council approved an Ordinance Declaring Local Emergency due to the COVID-19 Virus & Enacting Various Emergency Measures. Section 2(C) of that Ordinance authorizes the City Manager to address licensing and permitting issues, including suspension, upon concurrence with the Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem. Governor Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-10 further prohibits the operation of nonessential businesses and enacts various social distancing measures.

## § 6.3 SUSPENSION OF SOLICITOR REGISTRATIONS

All solicitor registrations issued under Chapter 33, Section 4 of the City Code are hereby suspended during the term of Governor Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-10, as extended by Executive Order 2020-18 or as otherwise extended. No additional and/or new registration certificates shall be issued during this time.



### HEALTH OFFICIAL RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Practice social distancing;
2. Washing your hands often;
3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and/or mouth with unwashed hands;
4. Avoid contact with sick people;
5. Stay home if you are sick;
6. Cover your mouth/nose with a tissue or sleeve when coughing or sneezing; and
7. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
