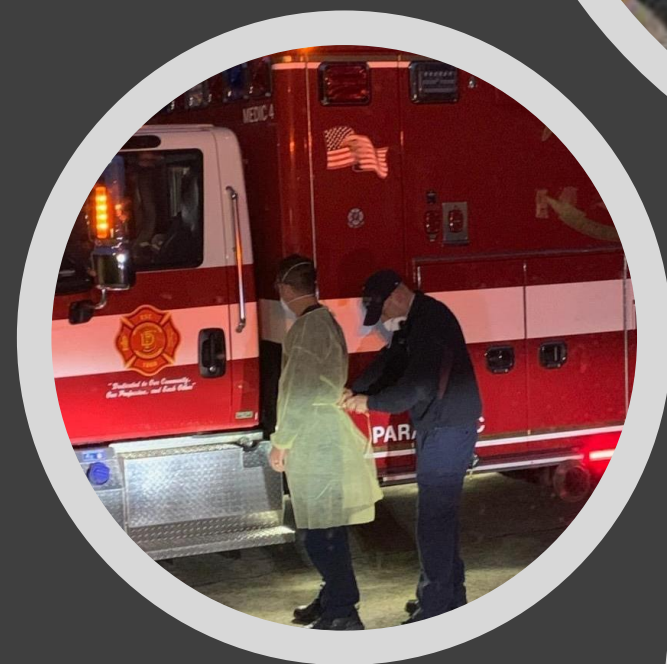

COVID-19 and the Fire Department

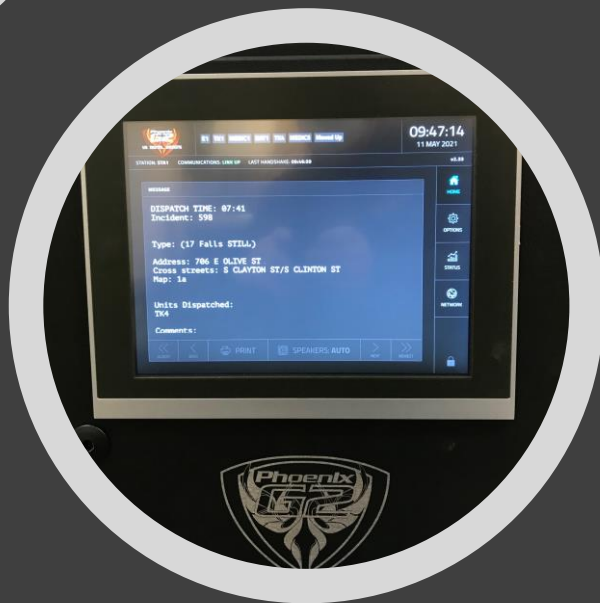
- Number 1 priority was the safety of our Firefighters and Paramedics

- Emergency Operations Center

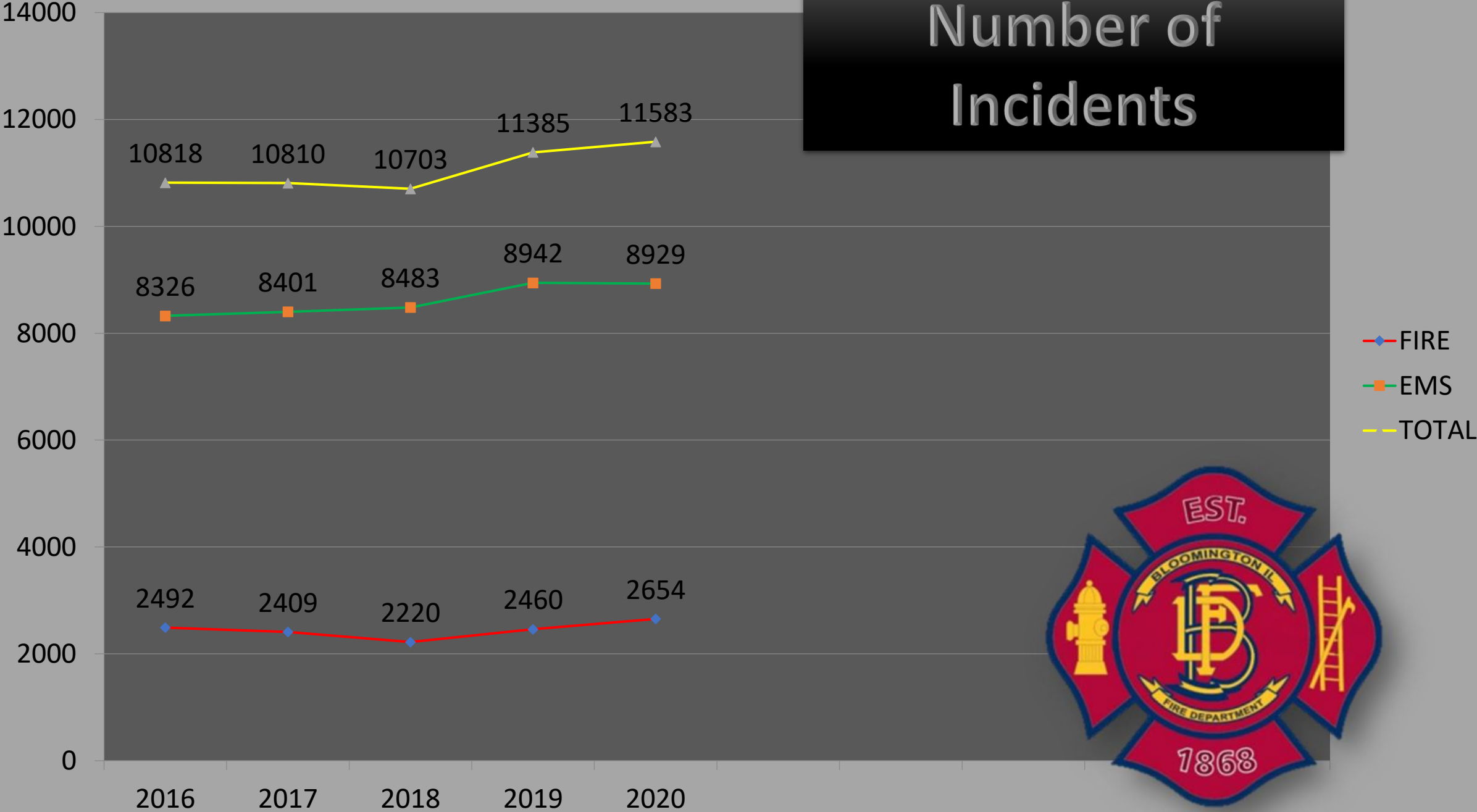


2021 Projects

- Continue building out the EOC

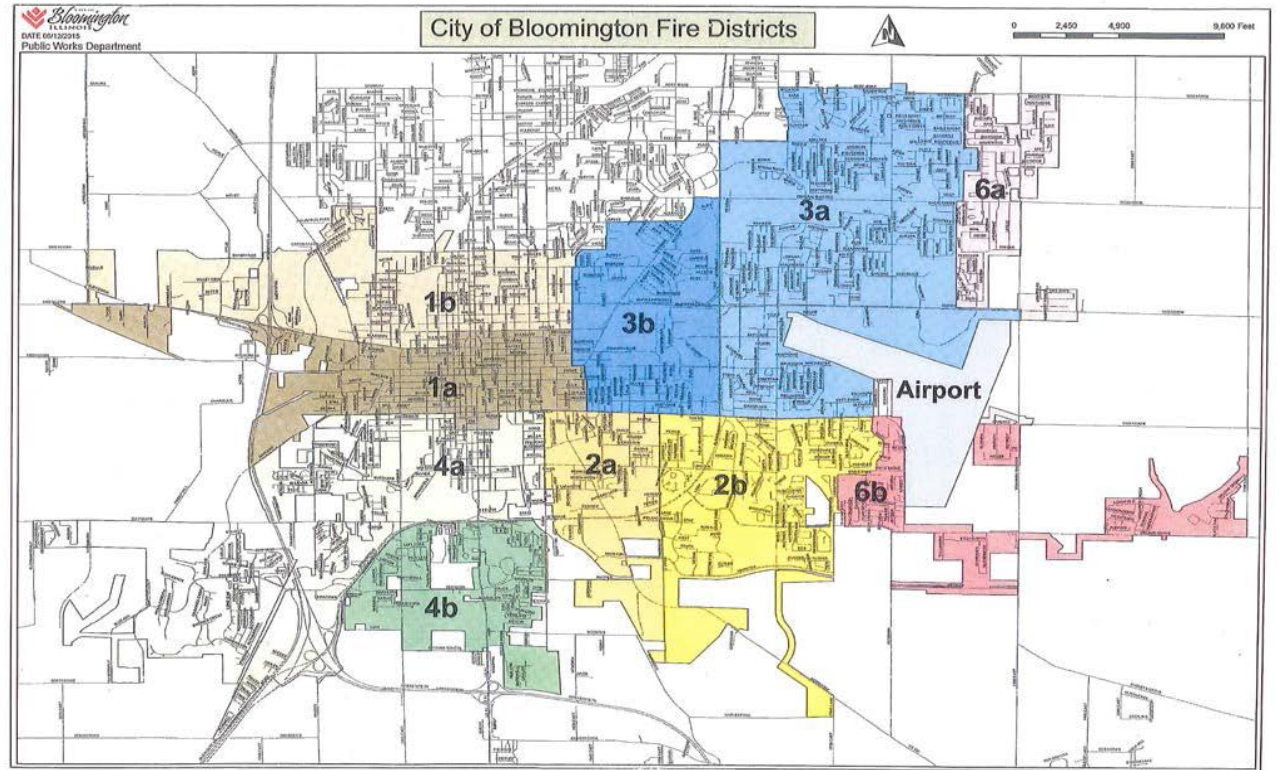


Number of Incidents



Incidents by District

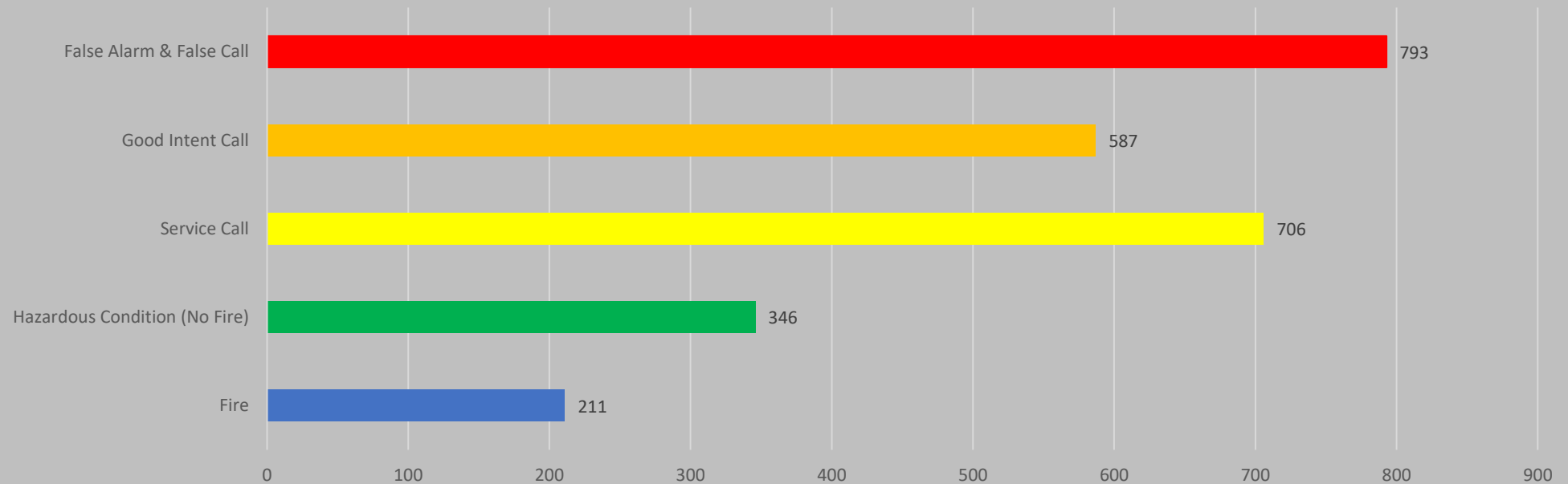

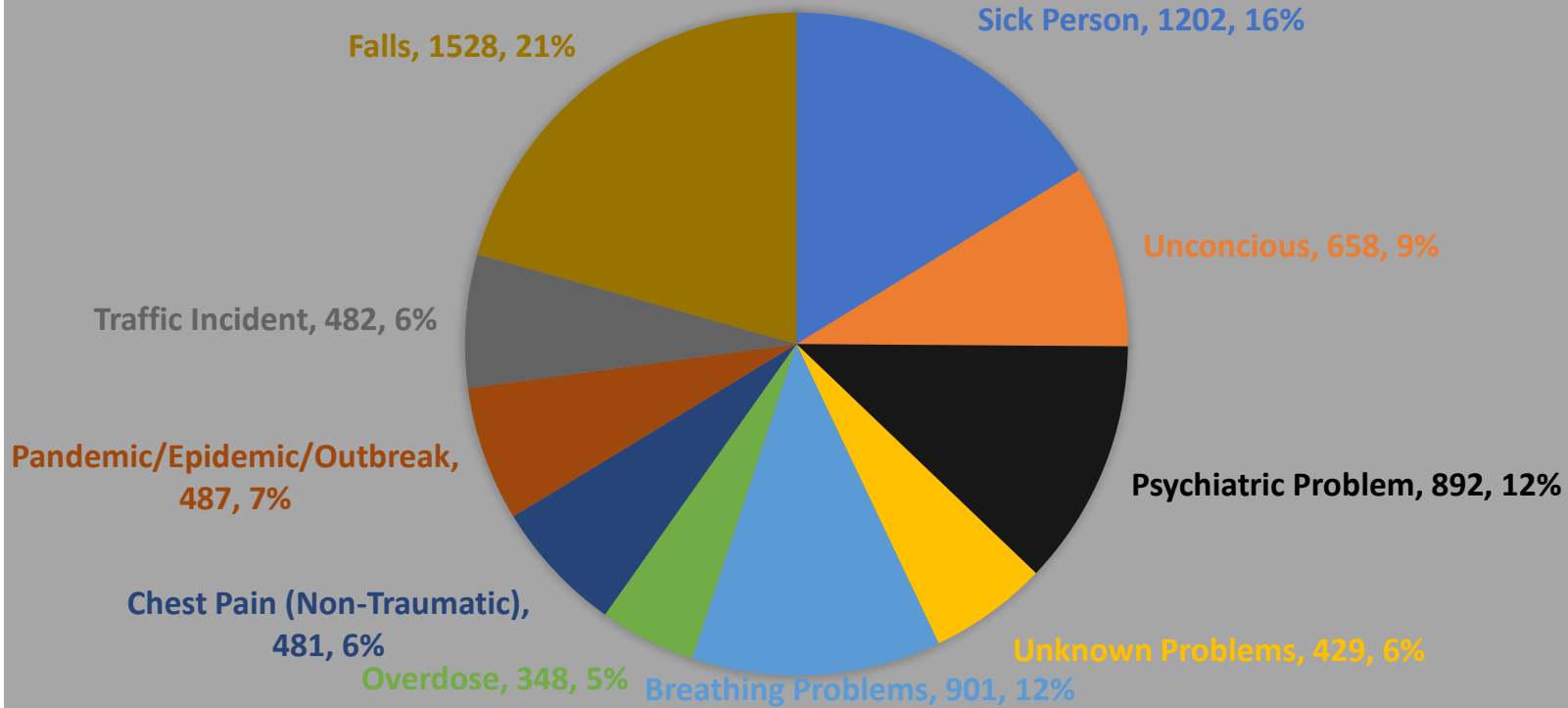

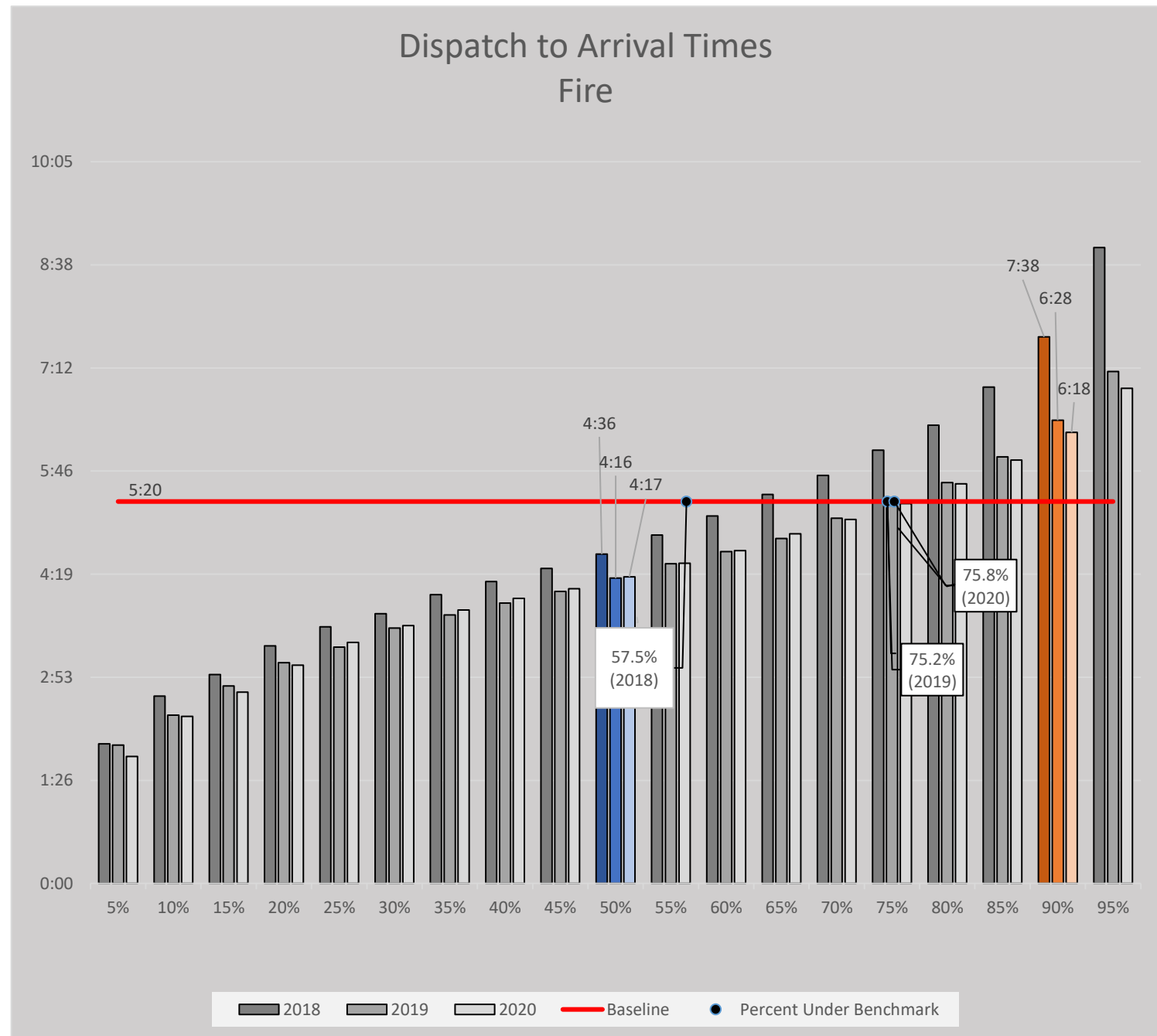
EMS Responses



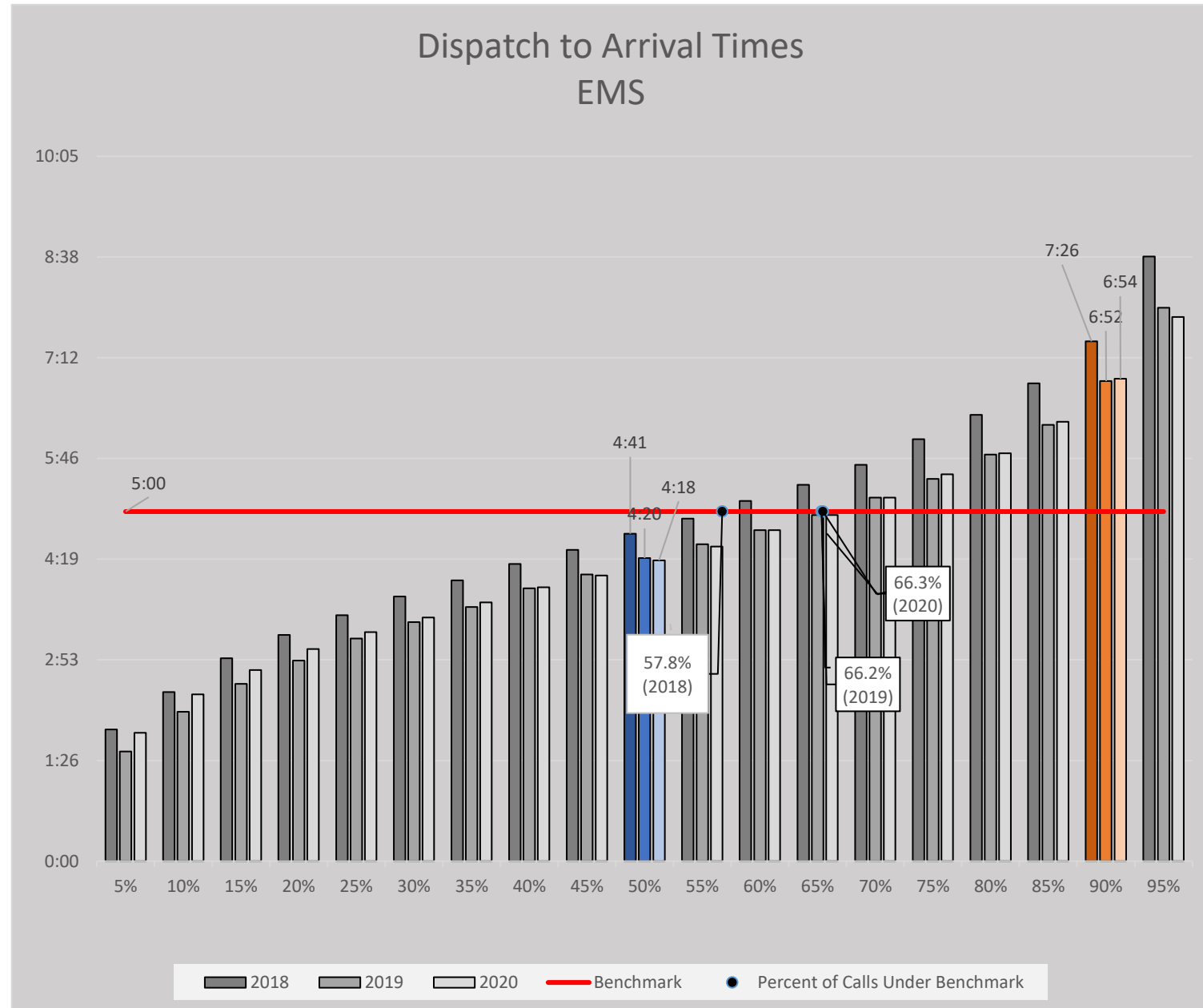
