

Proposal will shorten the Locust Colton project by several years while improving drainage for a wider area and will speed up the process for getting the work done.




Drainage Program: Proposed Next Steps

Schedule with IEPA Loan Funding (current schedule)



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Hydraulic Modeling - East Street Basin and Select Watersheds

- East Street Basin (Pond 1) hydraulic modeling, engineering design, and construction documents
 - Estimated cost: \$800,000 \$1,200,000
 - Targeting approval of engineering contract in October
- Hydraulic modeling for other select areas
 - Estimated cost: \$250,000 \$300,000
 - Targeting consideration during FY2023 budget cycle

Expediting Ordinance - What is it?

- Allows Mayor and City Manager to approve agreements, designs and construction documents under certain <u>limited</u> circumstances.
- Specific to sewer and storm water infrastructure projects
- Only for budgeted Items (approved by Council)
- Must follow applicable bidding City Code/State Statute bidding or current approved selection processes
- Requires City Manager to report approved items back to Council @ regular meetings

Overhead Sewer Program Changes

- Funding Increase to \$250,000 vs. \$40,000
- > Cover 2/3 of project cost vs. \$4,500

Direct Aid Initiative

- Things to consider:
 - The Council will need to identify the <u>public purpose</u> and ensure any private benefit is only incidental
 - Crucial test is whether the attempted use of municipal funds subserves the public interest and benefits a private individual only incidentally
 - Courts look at the object for which taxes and appropriations have customarily been levied and made
 - When it comes to identifying the "public purpose" the Council has discretion to make this determination, but discretion is not unlimited
 - Courts have also stated the definition of a "public purpose" is not a static concept, but rather is flexible and capable of expansion to meet changing conditions of complex society.

Salvation Army Flood Relief Support

Served 87 cases (individuals or families) for flood relief. Providing 63 Flood Clean Up Kits, 51 Box Fans and 78 individuals/families received financial support to help with appliances/furniture, clothing, lodging(hotel) and cleanup



Illinois Baptist Disaster Relief Agency

Provided clean up and haul away assistance at no charge to residents. 52 participants for a total of 2,580 work hours, using an average 10 hour day. 2 days each of travel time at an average of 6 hours per day for an additional 624 hours. There were also others delivering and setting up equipment which is not tracked but adds 50+ more hours

City of Bloomington Overhead Sewer Grant Program
