PRESERVATION PLAN PURPOSE

- Increase understanding of the roles historic preservation can play in community development
- Advance preservation-based revitalization efforts
- Integrate preservation efforts in all levels of community planning
- Develop a more formal heritage tourism program

PRESERVATION PLAN PURPOSE

- Enhance neighborhood livability through neighborhood rehabilitation and conservation
- Identify new landmarks and districts that tell new and untold stories of Bloomington's heritage
- Engage broader segments of the Bloomington community in heritage stewardship

PRESERVATION PLAN PURPOSE

- Update the 2004 Bloomington Historic Preservation Plan
- Made possible by a Certified Local Government grant from the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office



RELATIONSHIP TO 2015 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

- Update the 2004 Historic Preservation Plan to identify historic resources and strategies necessary to protect historic assets.
- Identify potential Neighborhood Conservation Districts to protect and enhance neighborhood character.
- Preserve and adapt significant historic buildings.
- Encourage increased use of economic incentives for historic properties.



- David Davis Mansion National Historic Landmark (1975)
- 14 properties individually listed in the National Register of Historic Places
- 4 Districts listed in the National Register of Historic Places
- 38 properties designated
 S-4 Local Historic Landmarks
- 3 Districts designated
 S-4 Local Historic Districts




THEME #1: KEY OPPORTUNITIES

- 4. Develop a more formal heritage tourism program.




