## Drive Merry, Bright and Sober This Holiday Season

Bloomington, IL - The holidays are a time for caring and sharing, which is why the Bloomington Police Department is partnering with the Illinois Department of Transportation to spread the word about the dangers of impaired driving with a "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" and "Drive High. Get a DUI." enforcement campaign. From Dec. 15 through Jan. 2, law enforcement across Illinois will show zero tolerance for alcohol and drug impaired driving to keep our roads safe and help ensure a happy holiday season.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's Fatality Analysis Reporting System, in the United States in 2021, a total of 13,384 people were killed in motor vehicle crashes involving an alcohol-impaired driver. On average, more than 10,000 people were killed in alcohol-related crashes each year from 2017 to 2021, with one person killed in a drunk-driving crash approximately every 45 minutes. These fatalities are preventable. Drivers must remember that driving impaired by alcohol, cannabis or any other substance is potentially deadly and illegal behavior.

Chief Jamal Simington stated, "Let's work together as users of the highway system to ensure safety. By embracing safe driving practices, all of us can make this holiday season memorable, merry, and accident-free. The men and women of the Bloomington Police Department wish you and yours a joyous and wonderful holiday season."

The Bloomington Police Department recommends these safe alternatives to drinking and driving:

• Designate a sober driver or plan to use public transportation or a ride-sharing service.
