




Aquatics Admissions

Miller Park Zoo maintained its accreditation from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums and hosted 66,476 visitors over the summer.

People played a total of **33,380 rounds of golf** at the City's 3 golf courses.

Bloomington Public Library











After two long years of construction, Bloomington Public Library held a ribbon cutting and Grand Opening party to introduce the public to its expanded and renovated building in August. Staff also led public tours, which included these new library features:

- Drive-up window
- 3 large community rooms
- 2 large children's programming rooms
- 8 group study rooms
- 12-person conference room
- Computer lab
- Innovation lab
- 2 recording studios
- Discovery zone
- Sensory-friendly room
- Nursing nook

Over the summer, the library attracted 18,918 participants with 110 programs, including a Juneteenth Celebration that drew 318 attendees. The library saw its busiest day on July 29 when it hosted 1,722 visitors. A total of 1,469 groups used the library's study rooms, and 182 groups used the library's community rooms.
